Landscape-Related Safety Issues

Safety is essential for all commercial properties. The liability that safety issues bring often takes precedence over aesthetics. A Landscape Professional can help property owners address and prioritize landscape safety concerns, ensuring prompt repairs when needed. Safety problems vary by property type, but being proactive is crucial. Our team often faces the following issues.

Plant Material Blocking Windows

When vegetation in planting beds obstructs windows, it creates hiding spots for intruders and reduces visibility. This problem often arises from plant material that is overgrown or unsuitable for the space. To address this safety issue, maintain plant material and understand the vegetation growth patterns.

Property Lighting

Commercial properties should have adequate lighting, including landscape lighting. Large landscape spaces can be very dark at night and may pose safety risks or attract unwanted activities. Light up sidewalks, trees, and plant beds to provide light to dark areas. Landscape lighting helps to address this issue and maintains the appearance of the landscape throughout the day and night.

Landscape Trip Hazards

Commercial properties often have trip hazards such as potholes, exposed tree roots, broken hardscapes, debris, tree stumps, fallen limbs, and damaged irrigation heads. To address these issues, fill potholes, cover roots with mulch or create planting beds, grind stumps, clear debris, and fix hardscapes and irrigation heads promptly. For all landscape-related safety issues, reroute foot traffic and mark off the area until the repair is completed.

Soil Erosion

Soil erosion can pose safety risks and lead to costly repairs if not addressed. Erosion can result from factors such as heavy foot or vehicle traffic, heavy rain, running water, wind,

and gravity. Concerns related to erosion include the property's slope, direction of water runoff, bare soil, and uneven elevation. Engaging a landscape professional with a license in soil erosion control is important for preserving the landscape and surrounding structures. Understanding the causes of erosion and methods for controlling it can provide both immediate and long-term benefits. Signs of soil erosion include bare soil, exposed roots, gullies, altered drainage, plant growth changes, and soil cracks. Repairing erosion can involve planting plants, mulching, laying sod, leveling the landscape, and installing retaining walls.

Drainage

Water accumulation on commercial properties is a safety concern that needs immediate attention. Recognize drainage issues by looking for standing water, stains, musty odors, dead plants, sinkholes, fungal growth, and insect infestations. These issues can lead to structural damage, tripping hazards, mosquito breeding, airborne diseases, and vermin attraction. Address drainage problems promptly to prevent long-term effects.

Maintain safety on your commercial property by regularly addressing landscape hazards with your Landscape Professional and with consistent landscape maintenance. Benefits of Commercial Landscapes

Businesses are more successful when they provide clients and employees with landscaped areas around buildings as well as plants inside buildings.

Here are some of the economic benefits of commercial landscapes:

- 1. A study found **7% higher rental rates** for commercial offices having high-quality landscapes.
- 2. Shoppers claim they will **spend 9% to 12% more** for goods and services in central business districts that have high quality tree canopies.
- 3. Shoppers indicate they will travel a greater distance and a longer time to visit a district with a high-quality tree canopy, and **spend more time there** once they arrive.
